


Picture Book Image Terminology

For Authors, Illustrators, and Designers




SPOT ILLUSTRATION:

An illustration that is smaller than a single page, with an uneven border, on a solid color page.




FRAMED ILLUSTRATION:

An illustration that is smaller than a single page, with a simple geometric line border, on a solid color page.



SPOT-ILLUSTRATION SPREAD:

A spot illustration that crosses the gutter (i.e., the inner margin).



FRAMED-ILLUSTRATION SPREAD:

A framed illustration that crosses the gutter.



SINGLE-PAGE BLEED:

A bleed juxtaposed with a page that is not a bleed.



FACING-PAGE BLEEDS:

Two separate bleed images, juxtaposed in a spread.



BLEED SPREAD:

A single image bleed covering two facing pages.


